STEP 1: ESTABLISH A TEAM COACH AND TEAM OF 3-5 STUDENTS

STEP 3: LET THE COMPETITION BEGIN!

Your team will be provided access to digital resources created by the expert team of judges to gain further understanding of the elements of aircraft design as well as mandatory milestones to guide your progress. Teams will be given the opportunity to ask questions and receive cursory expert feedback as you work through the challenge(s) during the months of August 2025 - February 2026.

➤ STEP 4: TAKE IT TO THE NEXT LEVEL

The maximum number of teams permitted to enter the competition is 25. Each registered team of students must complete their selected challenge(s) in the timeframe provided, including meeting pre-determined waypoints throughout to stay on pace. Each registered team that meets all timeline requirements are invited to carry out a poster presentation in person at the NMUSAF on February 20, 2026. The team members will convene in designated spots with their posters while the expert panel of judges travels from one team to another observing presentations and initiating questions through dialogue with team members. Each presentation will be within 5-7 minutes.
